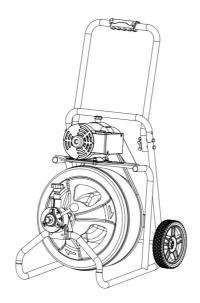

Use and maintenance of tools

- 1. Do not overuse tools and complete the corresponding work according to their purpose. Reasonable selection of tools to complete work according to their designed purpose will result in twice the result with half the effort and is safe.
- 2. If the switch of the machine cannot function properly, stop using the machine. Any device whose switch cannot function is very dangerous and must be repaired immediately.
- 3. Before adjusting, replacing accessories, or storing tools, the power must be disconnected first. These measures can prevent the risk of accidentally operating tools.
- 4. When storing electric tools, be careful not to let unrelated personnel, especially children, have access to them. Because electric tools are very dangerous for trained personnel.
- 5. Carefully maintain the tools to ensure that the cutting edge of the dredging head is sharp. Proper maintenance and maintaining sharp edges can reduce cable knots and make it easy to control the cables.
- 6. Regularly inspect the tool to see if the position of the moving parts is incorrect, if there is any damage to the parts, or if there is any other damage that may affect the normal use of the tool. If there is, please make sure to repair it before use. Many accidents occur due to improper maintenance of tools.

Safe use of dredging machines.

Safe use of dredging machines

- 1. Please wear randomly provided leather gloves and do not use rags or cotton gloves to grip the unblocking steel cable, as there is a risk of being caught by the unblocking steel cable and causing injury.
- 2. Do not operate the machine when the belt protective cover is removed, as there is a risk of fingers being caught in the belt and pulley and being injured.
- 3. Do not prevent the dredging head from rotating while the machine is running. This can cause excessive stress on the steel cable, resulting in torque, knotting, and even breakage, leading to more serious injury accidents.
- 4. Use gloved hands to operate the wire rope, so that the hands can feel the movement of the wire rope, thereby preventing torque, knots, and even breakage of the wire rope, and avoiding the occurrence of injury accidents.
- 5. The machine is two feet away from the pipeline inlet. Too much distance can cause the steel cables to twist and knot.
- 6. The machine is designed to be operated by a single person, and the operator can control the foot switch and steel cable alone. Once the unblocking head stops rotating, the machine must be stopped to prevent the torque, knotting, and even breaking of the steel cable, and to avoid the occurrence of injury accidents.
- 7. Do not operate the machine in reverse unless specifically mentioned in the manual. Reversing can easily damage the steel cable and is usually used to push the unblocking head out of the blockage.

- 8. Do not touch the running drum and guide tube with your hands. Unless the plug is unplugged and the machine comes to a stop, hands can only reach into the drum. Otherwise, hands may be injured by rotating parts.
- 9. Do not wear loose clothing or jewelry necklaces, keep your hair and clothes away from moving parts. Loose clothing, jewelry necklaces, and hair can easily be caught up in moving parts and pose a danger.
- 10. When operating and using the dredging machine, please use appropriate personal safety protection equipment. Sewers usually contain many harmful substances that are harmful to human health. Appropriate personal safety equipment includes safety eyes, gloves, and any other safety equipment such as masks, rubber gloves, protective blankets, steel toe boots, etc.
- 11. Maintain personal hygiene, wash hands and other body parts with hot soapy water, and do not eat or drink during dredging work to avoid inhaling toxic substances.

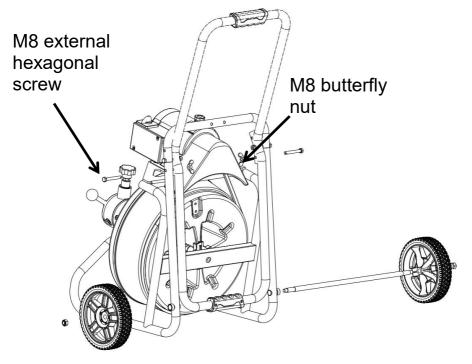

Assembly steps

- 1. Install the axle into the axle hole of the frame, install 8-inch wheels on both sides, and tighten them with M8 locking nuts
- 2. Unscrew the M8 butterfly nut and M8 outer hexagon screw, pull up the handle tube, align the hole position, and reinstall the screw. Tighten the butterfly nut.

Operating instructions

Attention: Before using this device, the following protective equipment should be worn (the entire machine does not include the following accessories):

- Protective goggles.
- Gloves.

- Anti slip shoes.
- 1. Place the dredger 1 foot away from the pipe opening.
- 2. Place the foot switch in place, ensuring that one hand always grasps the flexible shaft.
- 3. Turn the power switch to position 1.
- 4. Extract the flexible shaft from the machine and carefully place it in the pipeline.
- 5. Firstly, lock the locking knob of the telescopic device, move the feed direction lever of the soft shaft towards the direction indicated by F, and press the foot switch to send the soft shaft into the pipeline. (Note: The direction indicated by F on the soft shaft automatic feeding device is for exiting the soft shaft, and the direction indicated by R is for retrieving the soft shaft)
- 6. Slowly feed the soft shaft until it reaches the blockage or bend.
- 7. After the flexible shaft reaches the bend, it may twist or roll up. Please take the following actions when this happens:
- Pull the soft shaft back slightly to allow the front cleaning head to rotate.
- Push the soft shaft forward with force again to allow the cleaning head to smoothly pass through the bend.
- 8. 8. When the soft shaft reaches the blockage, it may be twisted or coiled. After this situation occurs, please take the following actions:
- Pull the soft shaft back slightly to allow the front cleaning head to rotate.
- Move the flexible shaft forward and extend it to the blockage.
- Repeat back and forth several times until the blockage is completely cleared.

(If the cause of the blockage is unknown, you can first use an olive spiral drill to explore the blockage, and try to bring out a block as much as possible for inspection to determine the cause of the blockage. Choose a more suitable tool to clear the blockage. Please note that the maximum outer diameter of the tool used cannot be greater than the drainage pipe inner diameter minus the size of 25MM.)

Frequently asked questions

1. What if the cleaning head gets stuck by debris?

Remove the soft shaft cleaning head from the pipeline, remove the debris from the soft shaft, and then extend the soft shaft into the pipeline to continue working.

2. What if the soft shaft cannot be pulled back?

That is when the cleaning head is stuck, turn the power switch to the REV position to reverse the motor and release the cleaning head from the stuck position, but do not let the motor stay in the REV position for too long (up to 5 seconds).

3. What should be done after unblocking?

Turn on the faucet or rinse the debris with a small pipe, paying attention to the water level to ensure that the blockage does not move to other positions in the pipeline.

If the soft shaft inside the drum is knotted, turn off the power, remove the drum and rear flange, clean the soft shaft, and then re roll it into the drum.
